Thematic Activities

We are pleased to summarise the key activities that had taken place during Term 2 and June holiday period. The curriculum theme on "My Community" allowed the children to explore age appropriate topics such as PG and N1 children on family and friends; N2 children on people in the neighbourhood; K1 children on transportation and K2 children on being a good citizen. Children's learning in the classroom were further reinforced through their outdoor field trips. Term 2 also saw the launch of our Start Small Dream Big (SSDB) and Innovation project to involve the children to protect the earth against climate change. To develop the children's safety habits, N2-K2 children participated in the road safety park activities and attended lessons on body safety to know their private body parts and what are good touches and bad touches. During the June holiday period, children were engaged in healthy lifestyle activities. Additional opportunities were provided for the K1 and K2 children to deepen their engagement and visual literacy in arts.





Learning journey to Tampines Concourse Bus Interchange. The K1 children had an authentic and experiential learning experience taking a bus ride to the Tampines Concourse bus interchange and attended a guided tour of the various facilities at the bus interchange.



Singapore Kindness Movement. This learning journey further reinforced the K2 children awareness of the characteristics of being a good citizen using the 5 magic words.



Tampines Fire Station. The N2 children had an experiential learning where they interacted with the fire fighters, observed, explored and participated in activities such as sitting on the fire truck, the fire bike, carried firehose and fire safety helmet.





Bedok library - Library Adventure Program. The N1 children visited the Bedok Library to gain awareness that library is part of the community and to nurture their love for reading.





Learning Journey to National Gallery Singapore (K1, K2). Children attended a guided tour conducted by an artist. Children were able to observe elements of art on the painting such as lines, shapes, colour. The children also observed a new form of artwork, a three dimensional sculpture. Children described the emotion displayed and role modelled after the sculpture to display its feeling. Inspired by the artworks, children drew what they felt and presented their artwork to their friends.





Road Safety Park

The Road Safety Park activity allowed the children to gain knowledge of the importance of road safety as a pedestrian, passenger and driver. The children role played various roles and learnt various traffic and road signages. They were able to apply road safety rules during the role play session.



Workshop & Program

Singapore Police Talk

The police officer shared with the N2-K2 children on "Let's Learn to be Safe". He cited various scenarios and quizzed the children to seek their understanding. He shared what are the good approaches that the children should practise to keep themselves safe should they encountered various situation.





SAM in the classroom

Children learnt about what is contemporary art from the museum educator. They were exposed to different art form such as tree sculpture using parts of tree encased in glass, installations using nontraditional art recycling materials. Children observed several artworks and shared their observations.







Vision Screening Workshop

Children learnt what are good eye care habits and how to prevent myopia. Thereafter, they participated a one-on-one vision screening which included the stereopsis test, height and weight measurement and vision screening.





Healthy Eating Program



In the month of June, children participated in several lessons and activities to further reinforce their healthy eating habits. Children learnt the different food groups and what constitute a healthy plate. They were made aware of what are the healthy food and unhealthy food. The K1 children visited the supermarket to observe the various food group and identify food with healthier choice logo. The children had a hands on session to make and savour fruits or vegetable salad.





Little Chef Session





Children had their cookery session to appreciate the Malay culture especially on Hari Raya traditions and Raya Goodies. Children made the popular biskut susu following step by step instructions. They measured the ingredients, explored with the ingredients and kneaded it to form a dough. They then manipulated the dough to form different shapes of biskut susu. After baking, they enjoyed their biskut susu during the afternoon snack.







Dance & Speech

The N2-K2 children developed an appreciation for multicultural dances such as Bhangra dance, Chicken dance and Rock and roll genre dance. They also articulated clearly and confidently accompanied with movement during the speech choir presentation.

Mother's Day Celebration

Innovation Projects



This year the N2-K2 children embarked on the Start Small Dream Big (SSDB) and Innovation project with a mission to protect the earth from climate change. The

children were made aware of the Earth is warming up fast and the human activities are causing the earth to get hotter and hotter.

Our special agents compared the different activities during kampong days that helped to maintain the earth green such as gardening, reusing things and playing outdoor versus the various activities now that harmed the earth like cutting of trees, generating more wastes, and excessive use of gadgets for play.

Children identified three kampong ways: **Gardening**, **4Rs**, **Conservation (GRC)** that will help to reduce our carbon footprints to save the earth. Children's knowledge was extended through a series of lessons and activities.
